## **Permanent Supportive Housing**

SSHH provides permanent supportive housing for 154 chronically homeless men and women with disabilities who receive weekly case management services. We identify the most vulnerable people and move them right into their new homes.

#### Transitional Housing

Our agency also manages a number of transitional housing programs in Sacramento County. We provide case management, housing location services, and a safe place to live for 3-9 months. Many of our programs are made possible through collaborations with other organizations such as Elk Grove HART, Wellspace, Sacramento Steps Forward, and the Cathedral St. Vincent de Paul.

#### **Housing Counseling**

SSHH conducts interviews focusing on rental history, credit, special needs, and income. These intakes help us provide informed housing referrals so that our clients can navigate the housing market with a sense of direction. Housing counseling takes place in several locations, including downtown Sacramento's Friendship Park where many homeless clients drop-in for free housing counseling.

### **Stockton Housing Location**

We also work with homeless clients in Stockton. Each client participates in our Ready to Rent class, and receives housing counseling and housing placement assistance. The Stockton Housing Authority has also contracted with SSHH to provide these services to homeless veterans with Veterans Assisted Supportive Housing (VASH) vouchers.



Renters Helpline & Fair Housing In 2016, the Renters Helpline responded to over 8,286 calls, helping 66% of families maintain their housing, and assisting 33% of families in relocating to appropriative permanent housing. Our fair housing partner, Project Sentinel, received 543 intake referrals by Renters Helpline. Over half of our open cases were related to discrimination on the basis of a disability, reflecting the needs of some of our most vulnerable residents.

# Homeless Assistance Resource Teams (HART)

HART is a collaboration between community members, religious organizations, and local nonprofits who are striving to end homelessness in their respective city. Currently, there are four HART organizations—Elk Grove, Rancho Cordova, Citrus Heights, and Carmichael. SSHH supports HART in obtaining their goals.

We embrace the Housing First model to ensure the lowest barriers for our clients.
