

2022 SACRAMENTO COUNTY POINT-IN-TIME HOMELESS COUNT

Every two years Sacramento County, its cities and the Sacramento Homeless Continuum of Care undertake an extensive effort to document every individual in the region experiencing homelessness during a 24-hour period. This effort, known as the "Point-in-Time Homeless Count", provides a single-night snapshot of nearly all individuals and families staying at emergency/transitional shelters in the county, as well as unsheltered individuals, such as those sleeping outside, in tents or vehicles, under bridges, or other places not meant for human habitation.

Most unsheltered individuals in Sacramento County have been facing prolonged challenges with housing insecurity and homelessness **since before the COVID-19 pandemic**

Rents in Sacramento have **substantially increased**, on average by **20 percent**, since the beginning of the pandemic in March of 2020 through November 2021



Veterans experiencing homelessness has **decreased since 2019**. Veterans represent approximately **7% of all persons experiencing homelessness** in Sacramento County in 2022



32% of family households with children were unsheltered, a **31% decrease since 2019**
