It was wonderful to provide shelter and care to so many during this wet winter. Both HART Volunteers and host volunteers were amazing – taking the weather of wind and rain in stride. Our intake spot at Lower Rodeo Park, was at times, fondly referred to as "Lower Rodeo Lake". Thank you Parks and Rec, for getting the flying awning back up and anchored!

The shelter itself moved through seven different locations. We had 11 host groups who took superb care of everyone during the evenings and overnights. Showers, dinner, laundry, game time, breakfasts to-go, fellowship – all of it feeding hearts and souls. And we had fantastic food weekly from Sutter Street Taqueria, Visconti's, That Dam Place, and Chick-Fil-A. It's always somewhat magical when we spend 11 weeks together – friendships are formed and guests become friends. Some of our guests began and pursued sobriety, looked for and began jobs, and took steps towards better shelter and a changed life.



HART mentoring, Powerhouse Ministry, Jake's Journey Home and Dignity Health were all great partners in connecting with people during the evening. It's always amazing to me when I think of how many kind volunteers are involved in caring for our friends every week: 84 HART shifts; 50 host shifts; 15 behind-the-scenes folks. Each one is crucial to providing the safe, calm environment that is so important at the shelter. One guest, after his first shelter night, said it was the best night's sleep he had in a long time. Another guest, after several nights at the shelter, said that he was starting to relax after always feeling on alert. If you were involved in the shelter in any capacity, those are the kinds of impacts you make. Thank you!
